I Daniel Dumbibin of New Hanover County, Towner, being
sick and weak in body, but of sound and disposing mind,
memory and understanding, do make, publish and declare
this to be and contain my last Will and Testament as follows, to wit,
First. I recommend my soul to God who gave it and my body
I desire may be decently buried by my Executor herein after named.
Second. I will, order, and direct that all my just debts and
funeral expenses, be paid by my Executor, after pronounced,
Third. I give, devise and bequeath unto my loving wife Ruth, my
plantation, houses, tanyard, with my three negroes Loo, Robin
and Bessie, with the sum of eighty pounds proc. money, which is
in the hands of my Mother in law, during her life; but if my
wife should marry, I give and bequeath to my loving mother
Sarah Dumbibin, my negro man named Robin. And in
case my wife should die without issue of our bodies, then I give
devise and bequeath unto my said loving mother, Sarah
Dumbibin and to my loving brother, Jonathan Dumbibin
all my estate real and personal whatsoever, and wheresoever
the same to their heirs and assigns forever,
Fourth. I give unto my loving brother, Jonathan Dumbibin all
my wearing apparel, gird, cutlass, gold buttons, silver shoe and
brace buckles. And in case my wife should die without issue of
our bodies, and also my mother and brother, Jonathan, then
and in that case I give, devise and bequeath all my estate
real and personal to my loving sister, Jane Ward's children
to be equally divided between them share and share alike, and
their heirs and assigns forever,
And I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my brother
and law Anthony Ward sole executor, of this my last Will and
Testament, hereby revoking and declaring void, null and of
no effect all former, and other wills by him at any time hereunto
made and declaring this only to be and contain my last Will

and Testament. In witness whereof I the said Daniel Dumbribin

in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ten
six.

In the name of God Amen. The twentieth day of
May in the year of our Lord, one thousand seven hundred
and sixty five, I Thomas Devine of Black River in the Province
of North Carolina and New Hanover County, being very
sick, and weak in body, but of perfect mind and memory
thanks be given to God therefor, calling to mind the mortality
of the body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men
once to die, do make and ordain this my last Will and Test-
ament, that is to say, principally and first of all I give and
recommend my soul into the hand of God that gave it; for
body, I recommend it to the earth, to be buried in a Christian
like and a decent manner, at the discretion of my Executor, al-
luding doubting, but at the general resurrection, I shall arise
the same again by the mighty power of God; and as to other
such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me
in this life with, I give, devise and dispose of the same in the
following manner and form.
It is my will and I do order, that in the first place
all my just debts and funeral charges be paid and satisfied
I send ~~it~~ It is my will, that my dearly beloved wife Mary
enjoy the use of all my estate during her widowhood except
at Long Creek, which I give to my well beloved son John De-
