praised be to the Supreme Disposer of all events; considering the cer-
tainty of death, and the uncertainty of the time thereof; do make
this my last Will and Testament,

In primis. My will and desire is that all my just debts and
funeral charges be duly paid and satisfied, Then I will, devise
and bequeath as follows,

To my beloved wife Rachel McLeod the one third of all my property
both real and personal,

Item. I will, devise and bequeath one third more of my property
both real and personal to John Barney, tailor in Lye in the Kingdom
of Great Britain (setting aside some small exceptions mentioned
in the after part of my will)

Item. I will, devise and bequeath the remaining third of my prop-
erty both real and personal to the above mentioned John Barney's
Sister Mary, together with six silver table spoons and half a
dozen silver tea spoons

As soon as conveniently after my decease, my will and desire
is that my Executors hereafter named, shall make sale of all
my houses and lands, together with my household furniture,
except the bequest already mentioned, together with my best
bedstead and such bedding as my beloved wife Rachel McLeod
shall make choice of

Lastly. I nominate, constitute and appoint Doctors John &
James Fergus to be executors of this my last Will & Testament,
hereby revoking and disannulling all former, and other Wills
by me heretofore made, and acknowledging, ratifying and
confirming this to be my last Will and Testament, In witness
whereof I have now set my hand and seal this fifth day of
September, one thousand seven hundred and ninety one.

liberty, immediately after my decease, this fifth September, 1791.

State aforesaid, being weak in body, but of perfect mind and
 memory, thanks be to God for it, do make and ordain this my
 last Will and Testament in manner and form following,
 and first. I give my soul to God who gave it to me, and my body
 I recommend to the earth to be buried in a christian like man-
 ner. And as touching such worldly estate wherewith it has
 pleased God to bless me with, I give and dispose of the same in
 manner and form following.

Item. I give to my beloved wife Mary Mc Lammey the use of
 my plantation wheroun I now dwell, together with my negro
 girl named Grace, one feather bed and furniture, during her
 natural life, and after her death said girl and her increase
 and feather bed and furniture to be equally divided among all
 my children then living.

I give to my said wife Mary, one negro woman named Lucy,
 one horse named Rogue, bridle and saddle. I also give to my
 said wife all my household furniture, two cows and calves, and
 the fourth part of my stock of hogs to her, and her heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my son George Mc Lammey and my
 son Elijah Mc Lammey, my lands and plantation on New Toprais
 sound, joining my brother Mark Mc Lammey, to be equally divid-
 ed between my two sons George and Elijah Mc Lammey; to be
 divided between them, when my son George Mc Lammey shall
 attain to the age of twenty one years. I also give to my two sons
 George and Elijah Mc Lammey, the land and plantation wheroun
 I now live after my wife's death, to be equally divided between them
 to them and their heirs forever. Also I give to my son George

 executors. It is my will that my son

 send my two daughters Mary and Mildred to school till
 they can read and write, and that said charges for schooling
 them should be paid out of the estate before divided.
 It is my will and desire that my stock of cattle remain on the
 plantation unsold for the benefit and support of my children
