I give to my grandson John Webb, twenty pounds of said lawful money.

I give to my granddaughter Elizabeth Webb, fourteen pounds and lawful money.

I give to my son Solomon Webb, one shilling and no more.

I give to my son Jacob Webb, one shilling and no more.

I give my sons Samuel and Isaac Webb, whom I make sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament, I give, devise and bequeath to them and their heirs all my lands, goods and chattels after paying my legacies and just debts.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 18<sup>th</sup> day of July and the year of our Lord 1749.

The within last Will and Testament of Daniel Webb, deceased was produced to the court, and proved in due form of law on the oath of Daniel Bradley, a subscribing witness thereto, who swor that the testator, was at the time of executing the same, to the best of his knowledge and belief of sound and disposing mind & memory, that Catherine Bradley signed at the same time as concurring evidence to the same. And at the same time, Isaac and Samuel Webb, appeared and qualified as Executors to the within Will, in due form of law, & declared that letters testamentary issued accordingly.
