

In the name of God Omnipotent. I David Morgan of  
 the State of North Carolina and County of New Hanover Plantation,  
 being in perfect health of body and of perfect mind and memory,  
 thank's be given unto God, calling unto mind the mortality of my  
 body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die  
 do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, that is to  
 say, principally and first of all, I give and recommend my soul  
 into the hands of Almighty God that gave it, and my body I  
 recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial  
 at the discretion of my executors; nothing doubting but at the  
 general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty  
 power of God; and as touching such worldly estate wherewithal it has  
 pleased God to bless me in this life, I give, devise, and dispose of  
 the same in the following manner and form —

First. I give and bequeath to Jeanne, my dearly beloved sister,  
 my plantation whereon I now dwell; also to my said sister, Jeanne  
 three hundred acres of land in Long Creek, neck; and all my  
 share that shall come to me of my father's estate, that is of  
 negroes, cattle and household furniture<sup>1</sup>; also all my stock of  
 cattle, horses and oxen to my well beloved sister, Jeanne as aforesaid  
 whom I also constitute, make and ordain my Executor with  
 John Purdie whom I also appoint my Executor to this my last Will and  
 Testament, and I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke and disannul  
 all and every other former testaments, wills, legacies, bequests and  
 Executors by me in any way before named made and bequeathed  
 ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and  
 Testament, In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and  
 seal this twenty sixth day of February in the year of our Lord  
 one thousand seven hundred and ninety,
