Item. If the residue of my estate shall amount to more than two thousand dollars I give the remainder to the extent of one hundred and fifty dollars each to my brother Ganett Gornto & my niece Mary E. Collins.

Item. If any residue should exist after the bequests aforesaid are duly carried out, then it is my will that my wife should have it added to her portion.

It is my desire that my wife Mary Tenill Gornto execute and carry out the intentions of this my will & testament.

On Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal, and publish and declare this to be my last Will & Testament in the presence of three witnesses revoking all former wills by me made this sixth day of November A. D. 1866.
