Item. I give and bequeath unto my dear mother, Dianah Blivers
thirty pounds sterling money per annum during her life from that
interest of my estate, to be remitted by half yearly payments by
my Executors herein mentioned, the first payment to be made in
twelve months after my death

Item. I give and bequeath unto my sister Elizabeth Cohen wife of Joseph
Cohen of London, and to her heirs, fifty pounds sterling to be rem-
itted her by Bill of Exchange as soon after my death as my Executors
conveniently can

Item. I give and bequeath unto my niece the eldest daughter
of my sister, Elizabeth Cohen, one hundred pounds sterling to be
paid her when she arrives at the age of eighteen, or on the day of
marriage, which shall first happen

Item. I give and bequeath unto my brother Nathl Blivers, five hun-
dreds sterling money

Item. I give, devise and bequeath unto my dear wife Peggy, during
her life and assigns forever, all my estate both real and personal
that I shall acquire of either, in Great Britain, this Province or
elsewhere (the legacies herein before bequeathed only excepted) and

that in as full and ample manner, as if the same was herein particularly mentioned and described, and lastly, I hereby nominate and appoint my dear wife Peggy Chivers sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament, revoking all other Wills, and declaring this to be and contain my last Will and Testament. In Witness hereof, I hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty eighth day of September, Anno Domini 1772, signed, sealed, acknowledged, published and declared by the Testator to be and contain his last Will and Testament in the presence of us
