publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament.

the usual manner at the discretion of my Executors and I look beyond the grave
in the faith and hope of resurrection and a life to come.
I give and bequeath my Negro slave Fango to my beloved Cousin Ann Sophia
Widow of Roger Moore and to her Executors, Administrators and assigns forever.
Thirdly, I give and bequeath all the residue of my Estate Real and Personal all my
Bonds, Notes, Money property and rights of property, of every description to my
beloved Sister, Margaret A Lillington and to her heirs Executors Administrators
and assigns forever.
Fourthly, I do nominate and appoint my friend and kinsman Edwin A
Anderson and George Davis to be Executors of this my last Will and Testament.
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal
this twelfth day of May in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and
fifty.
