I Eliza Claudia Bradley widow of the late Richard Bradley of the Town of Wilmington in the State of North Carolina being of sound and disposing mind and memory knowing the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time thereof and being desirous to settle all my worldly affairs which I have strength and capacity to do do make public and declare the following as my last will and Testament: I give devise and bequeath all the real estate of every nature and kind of which I may be seised and possess at the time of my death to my Executors herein after named or to such of them as my quality to execute this my last will and Testament to be sold by them either at private sale or by public Auction upon such terms as to them shall seem best and the proceeds of all such sales they shall divide among my heirs at law in the same shares and proportions as though I had died intestate. I give and bequeath a certain Negro Slave named Sandy to my five sons viz Richard, James S, Henry W, Charles W, and Alfred O and in the event of the death of any one of my said sons leaving a Child or Children such Child or Children are to be entitled to the share or interest of my son so dying. I give and bequeath all and singular my household and kitchen furniture to my three daughters viz Christian May B. and Lucy B and in the event of the death of any one of my said daughters leaving a Child surviving such Child or Children shall be entitled to the share of my daughter so dying. I give and bequeath to my son Charles W Bradley twenty Shares of the Capital Stock of the Wilmington & Raleigh Rail Road Company to be held by him in trust for the sole and separate use of my daughter Lucy B and her issue during her life and upon her death for the use and benefit of such Children as she may leave surviving her I give and bequeath to my son James A Bradley five Shares of the Capital Stock of the said Wilmington and Raleigh Rail Road Company to be held by him for the sole and separate use of my daughter Christian during her life and upon her death for the use and

benefit of her next of kin, I give and bequeath to my son Charles W. Bradley, five shares of the Capital Stock of the Commercial Bank of Wilmington and also five shares of the Capital Stock of the Wilmington & Raleigh Rail Road Company

I give and bequeath to my son Richard Bradley ten shares of the Capital Stock of the Wilmington and Raleigh Rail Road Company the foregoing disposition of Bank Stock and Rail Road Stock have been made with the view of equalizing the general division of my property made among my children hitherto

I give and bequeath five shares of the Capital Stock of the Commercial Bank of Wilmington to the following named persons in the shares and proportions following viz to Rebecca Green Bradley daughter of the late John Bradley two shares, to my grand daughter Eliza Clavin Wingate and Eliza Bonny Jewett each one share and to my grandson Walter Wingate the one remaining share. I give and bequeath to my grand children Eliza Clavin Bradley, Richard Brady Wingate and Richard Bradley Jewett to each and every of them one share of the Capital Stock of the Wilmington & Raleigh Rail Road Company

I give devise and bequeath my pew in St James' Church to my son Charles W. Bradley and my daughter Lucy B. Jewett

It is my will and I do direct that the division of my household and Kitchen Furniture which may be hereunto be annexed and subject the disposition I have herein before made of it shall be made by my Executors or such of them as shall qualify to execute this my last Will and Testament and that in making such division my executors shall value the different articles and shall not sell them as a means of ascertaining their value, I give devise and bequeath all the residue of my property and estate of every nature and description to my Executors or such of them as may qualify to execute this my last Will and Testament to be equally divided among next of kin in the same shares and proportions as though I had died intestate In testimony of all which I have hereunto subscribed my name this the twentieth day of January A.D. 1853 and I have Prominently Constituted and appointed my sons Richard Bradley, James W. Bradley and Charles W. Bradley as the Executors of this my last Will and Testament

I leave and bequeath to my beloved grand daughter Betty and Mary Moore two Negro girls named Leah and Hannah the Children of my Woman Penney. To my grand sons Gray A. Moore and John Ashe Moore

I give my Man called Abram the son of Easter

I give and bequeath to my grand son William H. Ashe the eldest son of John A. Ashe & by called Dennis to Samuel Ashe his 2^d son a boy called Robert To Gaston his third son a boy called Henry To his

Daughter Betty I give a girl called Mary the above mentioned Negroes Dennis Robert Henry & Mary being the Children of my Woman Easter

I give and bequeath to my son William I Ashe my man Will and a woman called Nancy the wife of Tom I also give and bequeath to him in fee all my right and title to the Catfish place being that situated purchased by me from the said William and my daughter Susan H. Grove the said purchase being properly evidenced by regular deeds of conveyance from each of them. I give and bequeath to my

son Thomas H. Ashe my man Jack son of Old Jack and Tom and do release to him all the claim of indebtedness held by me against him

I give and bequeath to my daughter Susan H. Grove my Negro Woman called Penney and her children with the exception of Leah and Hannah previously disposed of by this will.

I give and bequeath to my son Dr Richard Peter Ashe my man Richard the son of Walter and man Prince now lived out in Georgia but with the condition that my son Richard is to allow and permit my daughter Sarah Grove shall to purchase the said man Prince by paying for him the sum of Nine Hundred Dollars

I give and bequeath to Dr Ezekiel Hall of Knoxville Georgia the following Negroes Old Jack and his wife Jan and their daughter Ann with her children now or here after born heretofore on the express trust that he is to hold the said Negroes for the sole and exclusive use of my
