I Elizabeth Eager of the County of New Hanover, State of North Carolina, Widow, being in perfect serenity of mind and full enjoyment of reason, from a desire of being prepared to obey the summons of my Creator, when it shall please him to call me from this transitory life, do make this my last Will and Testament, in manner following, viz.

I give and bequeath unto my son John Guerau, the following female negro slaves, viz, Nancy, Pamela, and Harriet, (who with a negro child named Rhina, are the only ones remaining in my possession or belonging to me, out of sixteen left me by my late husband Darby Eager)

I also give and bequeath unto my said son John Guerau a water lot in the town of Brunswick, containing about half of an acre of land, together with all my proportion or share in the cattle or stock, upon his plantation in the said County of New Hanover for the same more or less.

I give and bequeath unto Margaret Thew an orphan, my bed and bed clothes, with all my wearing apparel, as a reward for her faithful services, and for the due performance and execution of this my last Will and Testament, I do appoint the said John Guerau my sole Executor. In Witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal this twentieth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty four.
