In the name of god our saviour. I Elizabeth Morris of North Carolina, New Hanover County, being in perfect health mind and memory, thanks be to the Almighty God for it. Therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body & knowing there is a time appointed for all men once to die, do make, constitute and ordain this my last will and Testament, that is to say, first and principally, I recommend my soul to Almighty God that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a Christian like decent manner at the discretion of my executors hereafter named; and as touching this earthly inheritance, which God has been pleased to bless me with in this life, I give, devise and dispose of in the following manner and form,

Item. I give to my well beloved son John Watts two negroes Ambrose and Morris, one featherbed and furniture, one desk, one table, one case and bottles, one chest, to him and his heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my well beloved daughter Sarah Price, two negroes Tilda and Eva, one beaufet, to her and her heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my well beloved daughter Elizabeth Watts, one negro man named Sampson, one bed & furniture to her, her heirs, executors, administrators or assigns forever, and no more.

Item. I give and bequeath to my well beloved daughter Ann Price, two negroes Kildare and Eva, one looking glass to her, her heirs, executors, administrators or assigns forever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my well beloved daughter Rebecca Morris, one negro girl named Blanche, one bed and furniture, six silver tea spoons, sugar tongs and hammer, six China tea cups & saucers, tea pot, sugar, and slop bowl, to her, her heirs, executors, administrators or assigns forever.

and as for my stock of cattle, hogs and horses &c I desire may be equally divided between my children after my just debts are paid.

Lastly I nominate and appoint my son John Watts, James Price, and Edmund Price Executors to this my last Will and Testament and I do utterly disallow, disannul and revoke all former wills and testaments here to fore made by me, ratifying and confirming this only. It is my will and desire that all my just debts & funeral expences be fully paid and satisfied; and what remains of my estate both real and personal I give, devise and bequeath unto my cousin James Brackin, Ann the wife of John Richmond, and Jane all Brackin sisters to the said James Brackin, of the County of Orange in the province aforesaid; To hold to them my said cousins part and share alike, their several and respective heirs, executors and assigns forever, to be equally divided between them and I nominate and appoint my trusty friends William Campbell Esq; and John Robeson Merchant, both of the Borough of Wilmington to be the Executors of this hereby revoking all other or former, and declining this to be my last Will and Testament.
