Catharine Nichols deceased of the said County and State did on the second day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety five, it being the day before her said Catharine Nichols death, verbally declare it to be her last will and desire, that her the said Catharine's grand son William Hines the son of James Hines, should have her negro girl named Hannah with her increase, and that the said negro girl should be under the care and direction of Walter, and James Nichols the sons of the said Catharine until the said William her grandson comes to the age of twenty one years, and should her said grandson die without issue, that then the said negro girl with her increase to return and be the property of the said Catharine Nichols heirs; and the remainder of her the said Catharine Nichols property, it was her will and desire, that it should be left to her three sons Walter, James and Michael; and the said deponent thinks to the best of her knowledge that the said Catharine Nichols was in her perfect senses and judgment at the time she made the above declaration, and further, the deponent saith not.
