I give & bequeath to my daughter Mary A Pollock two shares in
the Wilmington & Raleigh Railroad also all the money and what may
be due me by note or account at my death also One bed & furniture
which she has already had

I give and bequeath to my Son John St George one bed and
furniture all my stock of Sheep and hogs Eight Silver spoons
two table spoons and six Tea spoons likewise the balance of the
kitchen Furniture that I may die possessed of here after not
mentioned. I give & bequeath to my Daughter Ann E Vann one
bed & furniture which she has already had also One small mahogany
Table likewise Eight Silver spoons Two table spoons & six
Tea spoons I give & bequeath to my two Grand children John
E. and Mary Pollock one bed & furniture being the bed & furniture
that I intended for their mother which I shall leave in the possession
of my son John and his wife until the sd children call for them
It is my will that my two Daughters Mary A Pollock and
Ann E Vann shall have all the poultry that I may die
possessed of I hereby appointed my Son John St George my executor
to this my last will & Testament as Witness my hand & seal
April 6th 1854
