

In the name of God Amen. I, Frederick, Son of
 of New Hanover County, being in perfect health, and of sound
 and disposing mind and memory, but considering the uncertainty
 of life, do make my last will and Testament, in manner following.
 First. I bequeath my soul unto God, and my body I commit to
 the earth, to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter
 named, and as to my worldly goods, I dispose them as followeth.
 That is to say, I do first appoint that my debts and funeral expenses
 be paid by the profits arising from the labour, and service of my slaves,
 or by the sale of so much of the most perishable part of my estate, as
 shall be necessary for the same, or by both, as may be judged most
 for the benefit and advantage of my estate by my Executors
 then. I give and bequeath to ^{my} dearly beloved wife Sarah Jones, all my
 personal estate of what nature or kind soever, or whose soever to be
 found, also that estate left me by my late friend Edmund Boothby
 by will bearing date this thirtieth of January seventeen hundred
 and eighty one, to her and her heirs and assigns forever.
 Then. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah, all my stock
 of horses, and cattle, excepting the old mare well known by the
 name of Indian Hen, which I give and bequeath to my brother
 Thomas Jones, also my own colts, I give and bequeath to my
 brother Maurice Jones, my black pince filly, to them and their
 heirs and assigns forever.
 Lastly. I nominate and appoint my good friends Samuel ^{Ashe} ~~Samuel~~
 Frederick Jones and Thomas Davis esquires Executors, and my
 dearly beloved wife Sarah Jones Executrix to this my last will and
 Testament, hereby revoking and making null and void, all
 other, and former, wills heretofore by me made. In witness whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand and seal this first day of May, 1784.

of the mortality of human nature, think proper to make this my
last Will and Testament, being thereto entitled by my marriage
contract,

I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter, Susannah Larkins
one negro girl named Darius, as her right and property,

I give and bequeath to my beloved son William Jones one negro
named Tana; should my son William die without an heir, in that
case, all the property herein bequeathed to him, to fall to his sister
if living,

I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter, Ann Jones one negro
boy named Harry, and all the remainder of my property, with Dick
Larkins. I leave the management of my estate to my beloved son Wm.
Jones, and my son in law Dodge Larkins, who I leave Executors of
this my last Will and Testament, to be disposed of in manner aforesaid
this 9th of April 1787,
