Secondly - After my executor and executrix see my body buried in a decent and Christian like manner, and the funeral expence paid, it is my will that all or any debts I may be owing at my death be paid by them out of my estate, as soon as convenient,

Third - It is my will and desire, that all my estate both real and personal and all the worldly goods I may be seized of or possess at my death, go to my beloved wife Huldah. And I hereby give and devise to my said loving wife all the estate real and personal that I may die possessed of at my death.

Lastly - I hereby appoint my dear brother Joel S. Moore and my beloved wife Huldah Executor and Executrix to this my last will and testament.
