

In the name of God Amen. I Hannah Morgan of New Hanover, County in the Province of North Carolina, being weak of body, but of perfect mind and memory, praise be given to Almighty God, do make and ordain this my present last Will and Testament in manner, and form following, First and principally. I commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God, hoping through the meritorious death and passion of my Saviour, Jesus Christ to have full and free forgiveness of all my sins and to inherit everlasting life. And my body I commit to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named; and touching the disposition of all such temporal estate as it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me I give and dispose thereof as followeth; first my will is that my debts and funeral charges shall be paid and discharged.

Item. I give unto my younger daughter, Ruthy Perry, ten pounds prochy, to be delivered unto her, a twelve months after my decease to be paid by my Executors.

I will like manner, give unto my grandson Stephen Fox one saddle horse.

Item. I give unto Rachel Williams my elder daughter, all and singular, my real and personal estate, goods and chattels whatsoever, had or to be had, to her, and her heirs forever. I do appoint John Williams to be whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament, and I do hereby revoke, disannul and make void all former wills and testaments by me heretofore made. In witness whereof I the said Hannah Morgan do set my hand and seal to this my last Will and Testament this 24th day of September, 1768.
