

In the name of God Amen. I Henry de Lorinard of
Wilmington in the State of North Carolina, esq. being of sound
mind and memory, and understanding, do make this my last
will and Testament, in manner following, that is to say, first,
That my body be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors
hereafter named, and after payment of all my just debts and
funeral expence.

Item. I give and bequeath to Jonathan Demmet Tompkins, Clerk,
in Wilmington a lot of ground upon the N^o side of Market Street,
being thirty two feet front on Market Street, and running N^o one
hundred and sixty five feet, being part of N^o 79. 80 & 81 in Wilming-
ton aforesaid.

Item. I also give and bequeath unto my brothers James de Lorinard
in Ireland and Robert de Lorinard in London, all the rest &
residue of my real and personal estate of whatsoever nature or
kind soever it may be, to be divided equally between them and
their heirs forever.

And lastly. I nominate, constitute and appoint Jonathan
Demmet Tompkins and Doctor John Hergeis of Wilmington sole exe-
cutors to this my last will and Testament, revoking all former
wills and Testaments by me made. In testimony whereof I have here-
unto set my hand and seal this 15th day of October 1785.
