In the name of God Amen.

Isaac Newton of the above said State and County, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following, Viz,

I give and bequeath to my beloved son James, four hundred dollars, for the raising of which, I leave one hundred acres of land (lying in the aforementioned State and County, on the west side of the Indian Creek, beginning at a lightwood stump in James Newton's line, thence S. 65 West 127 poles to a stake, thence N. 25, 164 127 poles to a stake, thence N. 65. Et 127 poles to the said James Newton's line, thence to the beginning), my negro man Bill and all my perishables to be sold and if the above mentioned should raise more than four hundred dollars, I leave the rest to be equally divided, but if they should fall short of raising four hundred dollars, my children shall all bear an equal part in the deficiency. I make an exception of my negro man Bill twelve months from this date, unless my Executors should think best to sell him sooner.

I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Mary Ann, all my lands lying on the North side of Buckhorn branch, together with part of a two hundred and thirty two poles to a stake by a pond, this is to be reversed and continued across the tract, and my daughter to have the South end, and enough in the gap bay adjoining that to make four hundred acres in the whole. The rest of my lands I give and bequeath unto my beloved sons George and William, to be equally divided between them. I except the place whereon I now live during the lifetime or widowhood of my beloved wife Elizabeth. The land which I except lies on both sides of Doctor's Creek, beginning at a pine on the West side of the creek and running thence E. crossing the creek, 140 poles to a pine, thence N. 46 40 to a pine, thence N. 58. 164 24 poles to a stake between three marked pines, thence N. 32 Et 80 poles to a stake, thence ~~N. 69~~ (N. 69) 164 107 poles crossing the creek, to a stake, thence S. 32. 164 40 poles to a small pine, thence 164 70 poles to a stake, thence S. 112 poles to a stake, thence to the beginning, containing 143 acres.

I nominate, constitute and appoint my brother, James Newton and my son James Executors to this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other and former wills by me at any time heretofore made, in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 8th day of January in the year, of our Lord 1823.

In the name of God Amen. I, Joseph Newton Junior of
the County of New Hanover and State of North Carolina, being of perfect mind
and memory, do make and ordain this to be my last will and Testament,
hereby revoking all other wills by me heretofore made and declaring this only
to be my last will and Testament.
In primis. It is my will that all the property I am now seized and possessed
of, namely, two hundred acres of land in the County of New Hanover lying
on Federal Point, the same being in three several tracts, the land on which
I now live containing fifty acres, the land I purchased from John Hulet contain-
ing one hundred acres, which will more fully appear, by deed bearing date the 21st
day of April 1824; and fifty acres given to me by my father, on which Joseph
Newton Senior, now lives; together, with the following negro slaves, Matilda
Aggy, Moses, Sylvia and Dick; together, with my household and kitchen
furniture, to be equally divided between my three children, to wit, William
Henry Newton, Henrietta Newton, and Edward Newton.

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I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my father, Edward Newton
and my brother, Edward Newton, Executors of this my last will & Testament.

day of October, in the year, of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and thirty two.
