do constitute and appoint this writing to be my last will
and Testament, wishes and desires.

I give and bequeath to my ^{only} dear child Elizabeth Eagles
Haywood, my two lots in the town of Wilmington, reserving
the one half of the lot. Ned now lives on to his use and benefit
as long as he lives, after his death it all belongs to my afore-
said daughter, Elizabeth Eagles Haywood, and it is my
bequest, will and desire that the afore-said lots shall descend
to my grand daughter, Rebecca Jane Haywood at her mother's
death, and to Frances Ann Haywood in case Rebecca Jane
Haywood should not survive.

To my very worthy and good son in law Alfred Moore, I give
and bequeath my bed and mattress, which is very good and
comfortable at this time, and all the bed clothes belonging to it
for his own particular use.

In consideration of Ned's faithful services to me, it is my
will and desire to leave him his freedom the rest of his life, after
my death, he being now forty years old, that he may lay up
something for his old age; this I have much at heart, I owe it
as much to his mother as to him, who is the best part of my
heart. Ned was a friend and a mother to me, was a man
stranger entirely. Should there be any objections made to this my
heartfelt will and desire; I appropriate give and bequeath my
fourth part of the estate to Ned's benefit to set him free.

My bed room furniture I give to my good son in law Alfred
Moore, as well as the bedding, all it the room contains ex-
cept the trunk.
