Item. I give, devise and bequeath to the children of my late  
deceased friend Thomas Davis esq; and their heirs and assigns forever  
the bond given to me by Benjamin Smith esq; for one hundred  
and seventy five pounds sterling money of Great Britain, also all  
my real estate on Black, Peale, or any other place.  
Item. I give and bequeath to my beloved friend Samuel Swan  
his choice of my filly, got by Sweepes, from my mare called Fair  
she was got by Bessie.  
Item. I give and bequeath to my beloved friend Samuel Swan  
a note given by the said Samuel Swan payable to me for twenty  
two pounds, nine shillings, also one other note given by Col. Jacob  
Leaven and payable to me for twenty pounds currency.  
Item. I give and bequeath to my beloved friends George Moore  
and John Moore, my mare called Fair and her other filly, got  
by Sweepes, also my chest of books.  
Item. I give and bequeath to Mrs Mary Davis wife of the aforesaid  
Thomas Davis, my negro boy named Sam

Lastly. I nominate and appoint my friends Thomas Davis &  
and Samuel Swain to be my Executors to this my last Will  
and Testament, hoping they will see the same duly executed.

Francis Price, both of the town of Wilmington, my executors  
to carry this my last Will into effect. Witness my hand this
