

In the name of God Amen. I, James Foy of the State of North Carolina and county of New Hanover, being weak of body, but of sound mind and memory blessed be God; do this tenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & twenty three, make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner following; calling to mind mortality, I commit my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it me, to be raised in the general resurrection to life through the blood and crucifixion of Jesus Christ; my body to the ground to be buried in a decent and christian manner. And what goods it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life, I desire to dispose of in manner and form following to wit, First of all that all my just debts be paid & then. I give ^{and bequeath} unto my well beloved wife Henrietta Foy, five negroes, viz Tom and Sarah his wife, Tom his son and Sarah their daughter, and a girl by name Hannah, my chair and chair horse and harness, one bed and furniture. I also lend her one half of my plantation or cleared land where I now live, during her life time. I also lend my dear beloved wife two other negroes, namely, Joseph and Jacob her life time. I also give to my wife six silver table and six silver tea spoons. Then. I give and bequeath unto my son Henry R Foy six negroes, namely, Dick, and Nanny his wife and their children Sam, Lucy, Anthony, Selma, also the tract of land I bought from James Greene containing six hundred and forty acres more or less on Harrison Creek, also the cattle and hogs belonging thereto, also two beds and furniture, one large table six chairs, and kitchen furniture and plantation tools, together with one sorrel horse and one mare, I give unto my son Henry R Foy, to him his heirs and assigns forever. Then. I give and bequeath unto my daughter, Eliza Shepherd, four negroes, namely, Ophiam, Maria, Mary, Edmund; I also give her three hundred and fifty dollars out of the sales of my estate, one bed and furniture, one gray mare, three cows and calves, to her, her heirs and assigns forever. Then. It is my will and desire that Pollock, Marion, Zephny and Robin, be sold on a credit of twelve months, drawing interest after six months. Then. I give unto my daughter, Fanny, two negroes namely, Cindy and Abel, one bed and furniture, to her, her heirs and assigns forever. Then. My will and desire is that all my negroes that are not included in the above gifts, be equally divided between my four youngest children William, Fanny, Hiram and Joseph Foy, as they come of age or marry. Then. It is my will and desire that all the remainder of my land not given away, to be equally divided between my three youngest sons Hiram, William and Joseph Foy, after my wife's decease, and if either of them dies, for it to go to the other surviving two. Then. It is my will and desire that the money arising from the sale of the negroes, be equally divided between my four youngest children, Hiram, Fanny, William and Joseph Foy.

Item. It is further, my will and desire that all the remainder of my property that, not hitherto given away, be sold and equally divided (after taking the above legacy of three hundred and fifty dollars out for my daughter, Eliza Shepherd) between my wife and four youngest children Eliza, Fanny, William and Joseph Hoy, with the before mentioned property, to them, their heirs and assigns forever.

Lastly. I conclude and appoint Henry B Howard and Henry R Hoy Executors of this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this and date above written.

In the name of God Amen. I, John Hutch of the County of New Hanover, and State of North Carolina, being of sound and perfect mind and memory (blessed be God) do this the 27th day of October, in the year of our Lord 1828, make and publish this my last will and Testament, in manner following, viz:
 First. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Esther Hutch the plantation whereon I now live, during her life time, and at her death, to my son David Hutch and his heirs forever. I also give to my beloved wife Esther Hutch, my negro man Peter, together, with all my stock of cattle and hogs, and the rest of my property, perishable be the same more or less, (except that which I may hereafter mention in this my last will and Testament), to her, during her natural life or widowhood, and after death or marriage to be equally divided between all my children, to them and their heirs forever.
 2^d. I give and bequeath to my son John Hutch, my East plantation lying in the County of New Hanover adjoining the lands of Mary H George and Benjn Shepherd, to him and his heirs forever.
 3^d. I give and bequeath to my son David Hutch, all the lands I purchased from Alex B McCulloch, known by the name of Fork fields, to him and his heirs forever.
 4th. I give and bequeath to my son Charles Hutch, all my piney woods lands, which I purchased from John Averitt and M^{rs} M^{rs} Donald, to him and his heirs forever.
 5th. I give and bequeath to my daughter Henrietta Legoin three hundred
