do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner
and form following, that is to say, I will that all my just
debts and funeral charges be first paid and that as soon as
conveniently may be done
I give, devise and bequeath to my daughter, Ann Hall, her heirs
and assigns, my stock, of horses, black, cattle, and hogs, likewise
all my household furniture, my trunks, coopers and plantation
tools and my hand mill stones
The rest and residue of my estate of what kind or nature
soever, I give, devise and bequeath to my said daughter, Ann Hall
her heirs and assigns, when she shall attain her age of eighteen
years or day of marriage which shall first happen, and that
she be maintained and supported out of my said estate
Lastly, I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint Sampson
Moreley and William Moreley, esquires, Executors of this my last
Will and Testament, and I do hereby revoke, disallow and disannul
all and every other former, testaments, wills, legacies, bequests and
executions by me made or made by me, and I do hereby ratify and
confirming this and no other, to be my last Will and
Testament - In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
seal this twenty ninth day of June A D one thousand, seven hundred
and eighty six
