 I, James Hariman Kirkby, of the town of Wilmington in the County of New Hanover, in the State of North Carolina, Merchant, being sick and weak in body, though of sound mind, memory, and understanding, but considering the frail state of all sublumary things, do make this my last Will and Testament, in manner, and form following, that is to say, First and principally. I recommend my soul to God my Creator and my body to be buried in a decent manner by my Executors; and as to what property I may did possessed of I give and dispose thereof in the following manner, —
 All my estate of whatever nature, or kind the same (both in America and Britain) may be, I give, devise, and bequeath, unto my dearly beloved sister Harmanah Kirkby, of the City of London in the Kingdom of Great Britain, Spinster, to and for

her sole use, benefit and behoof forever, desiring that all my property in North America may be (so soon as conveniently can be done after my decease) put up to public sale (except one Gold Watch and a Gold Locket) and after all my just debts and funeral expences are paid, to transmit the net proceeds to my said sister in my name, my Executors hereinafter named may think best: earnestly desiring that the Gold Watch and Locket excepted from the sale may be sent on as speedily as possible to my said sister, Hannah Kirkby: And I hereby constitute and appoint John Johnston and John Allan of the town of Wilmington my Executors, hereby revoking and making void all other Wills by me heretofore made and declaring this only to be my last Will and Testament, In witness whereof I the said James Harrison Kirkby doth hereby set my hand and seal this twenty fifth day of August, in the year, of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety five.
