good Almighty and then Executors after named. I also desire all my just
able be paid as specially as possible after my decease; and after
they are discharged and the Executors paid at the most reasonable
rate according to justice, the remainder, if money, accounts, bills or
goods of whatsoever kind is to be remitted to my father John Hay, farmer
in Lincoln Land in the parish of Guilford in the County of Hasington
North Britain or failing him, to his heirs or assigns, if above five pounds
sterling, if less than the above sum, it shall remain for the benefit of the
poor of the parish of Wilmington.
Lastly. I nominate, constitute and appoint my friend John Ross shipwright

of the parish of Wilmington and David Gidewood his wife a
said town and parish to be my executors of this my last will and
testament, the ninth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand
and seven hundred and seventy four years.
