 being duly sworn on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God,
 deposes and saith that in the month of January 1785
 this deponent was at the house of James Robinson deceased, in
 company with James Deane, the said Robinson being then
 in a low state of health. This deponent mentioned the necessity
 of having a will, as the late act of Assembly had made some
 material alteration in the intestate estates which might not
 be agreeable to him; the said James Robinson answered and
 said, that he had a will by him but it was not signed, but saith
 he sit down by me and I will tell you my will, and agreeable to
 his request, this deponent sat down on the foot of the bed, and
 said Robinson began to relate in manner following, viz, all my
 estate which I have here shall be continued in the possession of
 Tabitha Robinson my wife as long as she lives, in the same
 manner as if I myself were alive, but not to sell nor dispose of
 any thing without the mutual consent and advice of my son
