In the name of God. I James Standley,
of the County of New Hanover, a State of North Carolina, being very
rich, and a weak man in body, but of perfect mind and memory, thank
be given unto God, calling unto mind the mortality of my body, and
knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain
this my last Will and Testament; that is to say, Principally and first
of all, I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty
God that gave it, and my body I commend to the earth to be
buried in decent Christian burial, at the discretion of my Executors,
nothing doubting but at the general resurrection, I shall receive the
same again by the mighty power of God. And as touching such worldly
estate wherewithal it has pleased God to bless me with in this life, I
give, devise and dispose of in the following manner and form:
First. I give and bequeath to my well beloved son James Standley
one half of my uplands; and the other half of my uplands to
my son Samuel Standley;

Also I give to my well beloved son Spirus Standley my mill stand
to support the mill, from the fork of the paths near my dwelling
house, straight across to the line.

Also give to my son James one cow by the name of Bloody,
and I also give to my son William Standley one cow by the name of Peaty,
and I also give to my daughter, Eleanor Standley, one cow by the name of Champion
and I also give to my daughter, Martha Standley, one cow by the name of Beauty,
and I also give to my son Samuel Standley, one cow by the name of Guinea,
and I also give to my son Spirus Standley, one cow by the name of White Flaxy,
and I also give to my daughter Sarah Standley, one cow by the name of Red Head,
and I also give to my dearly beloved wife Rebecca Standley, all the rest
of my stock, with one yoke of oxen and one horse colt, all my house
hold goods and moveable effects; whom I likewise constitute and
ordain the Executrix of this my last Will and Testament; and I
likewise constitute and ordain my brother, Spiris Standley, Executor
of this my last Will and Testament; and I do hereby utterly disallow,
revoke and disannul all and every other former, Testaments, Wills,
legacies, Requests and Executors by me in anyways before named,
called and bequeathed, ratifying and confirming this and no
other to be my last Will and Testament.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
10th day of January in the year of our Lord 1813,

I signed, sealed and delivered by the said
James Standley, as his last Will & Testament
in presence of us, who in his presence, and in
presence of each other, hath hereunto subscribed
as witnesses.

In the name of God Amere. I, Barbara Gellers
of the State of North Carolina and New Hanover County, being
of sound mind disposing mind and memory, do make and ordain
this my last Will and Testament, in manner following, that is to say.
I give and bequeath unto my sister-in-law Mary Smith, widow of
Alexander Smith, and her three son Peter, Smith, my three negro
boys Daniel, Bristol and Dick, also my bay horse.
Item. I give and bequeath unto my sister-in-law Mary Smith a sum
of my negro girl Peggy, for and during her natural life; and after
her death I give and bequeath the said girl Peggy, unto my nephew
Peter, Smith (son of Alexander, Smith). And it is my will that if
the said girl Peggy should have issue, the same shall be divided
equally, between my nieces the daughters of Alexander, Smith aforesaid.
Item. I give and bequeath unto my niece Mary Smith (daughter of Alex
Smith) my negroes Anna and Peter, and one bed and furniture.
Item. I give and bequeath unto my two nieces Catharine Morris and
Grace Smith (daughters of Alexander, Smith) my negro woman Rhoda
and her child Elizabeth and their increase.
Item. I give and bequeath unto my nieces Barbara McNeill &
Margaret Smith (daughters of Alexander, Smith) my negro woman
Betty and her child Ely and their increase.
Item. I give and bequeath unto my nieces Barbara McNeill (daughter
of Alexander, Smith) one bed and furniture.
Item. I give and bequeath unto my five nieces, the daughters of
Alexander, Smith, my negro woman named Maggy, and all the
cattle I may have at my death, except one cow.
Item. I give and bequeath unto John Robertson (son of Duncan
Robertson) one cow, and calf.
Item. I give and bequeath to my niece Mary Smith (daughter of Alex
Smith) my large chest and my looking glass.
Item. I give and bequeath all the rest of my household furniture
unto my five nieces (the above mentioned daughters of Alex, Smith).
Item. It is my will and desire that the legacies in this my last Will
and Testament (children of Alexander, Smith) pay out of the respective
