

In the name of god Amen. I, John Herring
of the Province of North Carolina and New Hanover County, Plan-
ter, being in good health and perfect mind and memory, before
be goode for his mercy, calling to minde the mortality of man
and that it is ordaineed for all mankind once to die, do make
myne and ordaine this my last will and Testament, That is
to say, first of all, I recommend my soul unto the hands of
a almighty God that at first gave it; and my body, I recommend
to the earth, to be buried in decent Christian burial at the direc-
tion of my Executors, not doubting but at the general resurrection
I shall receive the same by the mighty power of God. And touching
such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to blesse me with
(my just debts and funeral charges being first paid) I will and
bequeath in following manner, and form, First,
Imprimis. I give and bequeath unto my well beloved son Richard
Herring, one negroe wench named Sally, and one feather bed
Item. I give and bequeath unto my well beloved daughter Sarah Herring
one feather bed
Item. I give and bequeath to my well beloved daughter Martha Herring
my negroe fellow named Jack paddy, and one feather bed
Item. I give and bequeath unto my dearely beloved wife Rebecca Herring
her living and maintenance off my estate, during her lifetime
Item. I give and bequeath unto my well beloved son John Herring
four negroes named as follows, Bift, one wench named Rose and
all her increase forever, also three negroe boys named Isaac, Ben,
and Jack. Also all and singalay my lands, tenements, dwelling
houses and out houses, plantations and orchards, gardens and
inclosures of fruit trees, with all the remains and remainders
of my estate, private and personal, within doors and without,
consisting of horses, cattle, hogs, sheep and porretay, household
furniture, goods and chattels, weareing apparel, ready money, book
debts, bonds, notes of hand, patents, deeds, and implements of
husbandry, and every other article to me in any way belonging
except what I before willed and named as above.
It is also my will that my son John Herring shall be my Executor,
and I do name, constitute and ordaine him the said John Herring
the sole and absolute executor of this my last will and testament,
and it is also my will, that no part or parcel of my estate shall
be broke in upon, or divided, or the property in any wise altered during
the natural lifetime of my wife Rebecca Herring, if it please the Lord
that she should live longer than I; and at her death and not till
then, the said estate shall be divided and paid away, agreeable to the
true intent and meaning of this will, and that it shall be construed
in no other meaning but in the simple plain meaning of the words
by me spokēd. And I do hereby revoke, repeal, reverse and disannule

all other, wills and bequests, by me in any wise made, or claimed or named, admitting, confirming, ratifying and ordaining this and no other to be my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I the said John Horning have hereunto set my hand and seal this 25th day of October, 1773.

publish and declare the within to be and contain his last will
and Testament and that at the time thereof he was of sound and
disposing mind and memory. At the same time John Horning
Executor therein named qualified as such agreeable to law.

I James Hay now of Wilmington in said Province, Shipwright,
being very sick and weak in body but of sound and disposing mind
and memory, thanks be to Almighty God, do make and ordain this
to be and contain my last will and Testament, revoking and making
null and void all former, wills and Testaments by me heretofore
made. First I desire my body may be buried decently in a
beneath my soul Christian like manner at the discretion of my
God Almighty and then Executors after named. I also desire all my just
debts be paid as specially as possible after my decease; and after
they are discharged and the Executors paid at the most reasonable
rate according to justice, the remainder, if money, accounts, bills or
goods of whatsoever kind is to be remitted to my father John Hay, farmer
in Lincoln Land in the parish of Guilford in the County of Hasington
North Britain or failing him, to his heirs or assigns, if above five pounds
sterling, if less than the above sum, it shall remain for the benefit of the
poor of the parish of Wilmington.

Lastly. I nominate, constitute and appoint my friend John Ross shipwright
