In the name of God. Amen,

I John Hile Sauls of
Huntington County in the State of North Carolina,
being through the Mercy of God, of Sound Mind and
Memory, do make, publish, declare and Ordain this and
this Only to be My last Will and Testament, revoking
and Making void all former Wills by me heretofore
made, The Lord have Mercy on my Soul for Christ
sake!

In the first place, I give, grant, will and
desire unto my good friends David M'Cuttre and William
S. Ashe, their heirs and assigns all my property, real
personal and mixed, to be held ~~meritarily~~ by them in
trust for the benefit and advantage of my Sisters
Mary Bourdeau and Margaret Sauls, so that they
may Annually receive all the interest and profits
arising from my estate, and a receipt given by
them either Jointly or Separately with or without the con-
sent of their husbands shall be a full release and acqui-
=ance of my trustees from all liability and responsi-
=bility whatsoever,

In the Second place; It is my wish
and desire that any interest in my estate which
either of my above mentioned Sisters may have under
this Will, Shall on her decease pass to her children if she
leaves any, but if either should die leaving no ~~issue~~ heirs
of her body, her interest shall pass to and be vested in
the survivor or the heirs of her body,

In the third place; It is my will and desire that if
the proportionate Share in the profits of my estate should
be insufficient to support and to make comfortable
either of my Sisters, the trustees be empowered to sell and
dispose of any property I may leave to make her
comfortable

In the fourth place; I nominate, constitute
into and appoint my Good friends David M'Cuttre
& William S. Ashe my Executors, with full powers
to manage my estate in any manner, which in
their Judgment may be for the best, In witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed
My Seal February 15th 1860
