of the County of New Hanover, in the State of North Carolina, Gentleman
do make this my last will and Testament in manner and form
following, that is to say,
First. I bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God, hoping
and believing a remission of my sins by the merits and mediation
of Jesus Christ; and my body I commit to the earth to be decently
buried at the directions of my Executors here after named; and my
worldly estate I give and devise as follows —
In premises I give and bequeath unto John Howard Blanks, son of William
Blanks my negroes, by named Judy, Randolph, and Hugle, to him
and his heirs forever —
Item. I give unto Susanna Howard, and Elizabeth Howard, my stock
of cattle, and a Romenous Head, to be equally divided between
them by my executors —
Lastly. I do nominate and appoint William Blanks and Henry
Walker Executors to this my last will revoking all other Wills that
have been heretofore made —
And if John H. Blanks should die without issue I give the said
negroes to his brother Ingram Blanks, to him and his heirs and
aspirs forever — Signed, sealed, published and acknowledged to be
my last Will and Testament, in the presence of & dated this third
day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred
and eighty nine —
