but aware of the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make
ordain, publish and declare this my last Will and Testament
in manner and form following, that is to say:
First. It is my will and I so direct, that my Executor (herein
after named) shall pay all my funeral expences, and my
just debts to whomsoever owing, out of any money or monies
which may come into his hands as part or parcel of my estate
and I further empower him to sell any portion whether real
or personal of my estate, which he may deem most ad-
vantageous, for the purpose of realizing a sufficient sum to
pay my debts, and upon such terms as he may deem most
advisable.
I give and devise all my estate, whether real or personal after
the payment of my debts, to William Bell^{ch} McIntyre, consisting
of the following slaves (to wit) Venus and Rufus and their
increase, my horse and cart, also all my fishing tackle
consisting of boats, seines &c. &c. also my land on Federal
Point or near it lying in New Hanover County, I have and
to hold the same to him the said William Bell^{ch} McIntyre and his

his forever,

and I do hereby constitute and appoint the said William McIntyre my lawful Executor, to execute this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and declaring void all other Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made.

In Witness whereof I the said John Gulett do hereunto set my hand this the fourth of December, 1849.
