

In the name of God Ammen. I John M Anders being
in a low state of health and considering the uncertainty of
life and the certainty of death, think proper that my worldly
estate should be disposed of after my death in the following
manner, to wit,

I give and bequeath unto my brother, James my negro man Toby
I give and bequeath unto my father, and brother, Elisha all my land
I give and bequeath unto my niece Mary Pridgen my bureau
which she shall take into her possession after the death of my father
I give and bequeath unto my brother, James, all my other property
of every description and denomination whatever, and that
he shall pay all debts contracted by me, out of the legacy which
I have left him, and he shall further cause to be erected a Tomb
stone over my grave, with a suitable inscription thereon. I
make my brother, James Executor to this my last will and
testament. - Sept. 29th 1825 -
