And as touching my worldly goods I do give and dispose of in the following manner, I do also appoint and chuse Simon Sellers and his wife Executor and Executrix.

Two gelding horses I do leave in hands of my Executor to be sold, and the money or property I do give to my brother Henry M<sup>r</sup> May; also two mares and a year old horse I give to Henry M<sup>r</sup> May. I do also leave in the hands of my Executor, one rifle gun and one cause, to sell, and the money I do give to the above mentioned Henry M<sup>r</sup> May.

In witness hereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 15<sup>th</sup> of August, 1795.

I will and desire to my loving wife Ruth Mott, all the real and personal estate during her widowhood, and to be disposed of by her as hereafter mentioned.

Item. It is my will and desire that the sum of one shilling sterling be paid to my daughter Ann M<sup>r</sup> Kennedy.

Item. I will and desire to my daughter Elizabeth Mott, one fifth part,
