

In the name of God Amen. I, John Oliver, of New  
 Hampshire, County, being of sound mind and memory, do make  
 constitute and appoint this my last Will and Testament—  
 Inprimis. I give, bequeath, and devise unto all my children  
 that tract of land on which I now live, known by the name of the  
 Rocky Point tract, to be equally divided among them, and so as to  
 give an equal proportion of the good land to them all—  
 Item. I do direct that my New River lands be sold for the pay-  
 ment of my debts—  
 Item. I give and bequeath unto my wife Sarah Oliver, three  
 negroes, viz, Bella, Sam and Hannah; the remainder of my  
 negroes to be equally divided among all my children. Will to  
 choose his mistress—  
 It is my will that all my stock, of cattle be kept together, for  
 the benefit of my family—  
 Item. Notwithstanding what has been heretofore said with respect  
 to my Rocky Point tract, I do will, that if my wife and executors  
 see cause, they are authorized to sell the same and purchase other  
 lands, in any other place that shall appear to them more ad-  
 vantageous, and my wife to have possession during her life—  
 Lastly. I do hereby nominate and appoint my wife Sarah  
 Oliver, and my brother, Francis Oliver, Executors & Executor  
 to this my last Will and Testament, and to see the same duly  
 executed— In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and  
 seal this 15<sup>th</sup> day of June 1794,
