Also one hundred acres as far as the race paths, out of the 250 acres joining my old line. Also my negro man named Jacky, also all my stock of cattle, horses, sheep and hogs. Also all my household furniture and plantation tools. Also a task hill that is now a building. I also constitute and appoint him, and my beloved friend John Jones my Executor of this my last will and Testament, in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty fifth day of November, anno Dom 1782.

I give and bequeath unto my son Etherington Rotchel a tract of land, where I now live containing forty acres, with all its improvements what so ever, with every other article which I now possess, after the decease of my wife Sarah Rotchel, who is to be allowed every privilege which she enjoyed in my life time, during her life.

being duly sworn on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God,
depose and say that in the month of January 1785
this deponent was at the house of James Robinson deceased, in
company with James Devane, the said Robinson being then
in a low state of health. This deponent questioned the necessity
of leaving a will, as the late act of Assembly had made some
material alteration in the intestate estates which might not
be agreeable to him, the said James Robinson answered and
said, that he had a will by him but it was not signed, but said
he sit down by me and I will tell you my will; and agreeable to
his request, this deponent sat down on the foot of the bed, and
said Robinson began to relate in manner following, viz. all my
estate which I have here shall be continued in the possession of
Sabina Robinson my wife as long as she lives, in the same
manner, as if myself were alive, but not to sell nor dispose of
any thing without the mutual consent and advice of my son
Benjamin Robinson; and after her death the whole of the estate
