William Wilkinson and James & Kennedy signed as concuring wit-
nesses with him at same time.

In the name of God Arise. I, John Williams
of the Welsh Tract in the County of New Hanover, and Province
of North Carolina, deceased, being in perfect health of body, and
of sound mind and memory, blessed be God for the same, calling
to mind the mortality of my body, and that it is ordained for
all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last Will
and Testament in manner, and form following, that is to say
first and chiefly, I recommend my soul to God that gave it, hop-
ing through the merits and intercession of my blessed Saviour, and
Redeemer, Jesus Christ for the salvation of my sins. and my body
I commit to the earth to be decently buried in a Christian like
manner, at the discretion of my Executor here after named; and
for what worldly estate it hath pleased God to bless me with in
this life, I give, devise and dispose of in manner, and form following
hereinafter, and it is my will that all my just debts and
financial charges be first paid and discharged by my Executor here
after named.

I give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife Rachel Williams
my riding horse and sidesaddle, and also the plantation whereon
I now dwell, together with the tract and tracts of land therunto bel-
onging, to be possessed by her during her natural life, and after

her decease, to be disposed of in manner, and form following,
Item. I give and bequeath to my second son Nehemiah Williams
that tract or tract of land containing 200 acres, lying being
known by the name of Souakin, to be possessed by him and his heirs
forever,

Item. Further, and it is my will, that the plantation whereon I
now dwell after the decease of my well beloved wife Rachel Willi-
ams, shall go to my third son Stephen Williams, to be possessed
by him and his heirs forever,

Item. I give and bequeath unto each of my children, two cows
and calves, to be delivered to them separately by my executors hereafter
named, at the age of twenty one years on the day of marriage
which shall first happen,

Item. I give and bequeath all the rest of my good and chattels
not heretofore given, to my well beloved wife Rachel Williams
to be possessed by her during her natural life, and at her death
to be equally divided between my children; but in case of her
marriage, she is to take one third, and the rest to be equally di-
vided between my children.

Item. I appoint, constitute make and ordain my said well
beloved wife Rachel Williams, to be my whole and sole Executrix
of this my last Will and Testament,

Lastly. I do hereby revoke and disannul all and every other, &
former, Wills and Testaments by me made, either in writing or
writing, ratifying this and no other, to be my last Will and Testament.
