In the name of God Amen,
 I, Joel Parish of the State and County aforesaid, calling to mind the
 uncertainty of life, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once
 to die, and being about to embark, on a voyage to see, fully apprised
 of the dangers thereof, do make and ordain this my last will and
 testament, in the manner and form following, that is to say, first of
 all, I commend my soul to the care of Almighty God who gave it,
 humbly confiding through his divine grace and providence to reap
 an endless life of bliss and happiness in eternity. Touching my worldly
 goods wherewithal it hath pleased the Lord to bless me with in this life
 I dispose of the same in the following manner:

1^o. I give and bequeath unto my son James L. Parish, all my lands
 on the east side of Long Creek, including the plantation I now reside
 on, and the Mulberry, containing eleven hundred and seventy-five
 acres, also the following negroes Rachel, Joe, Tim, Amy and her chil-
 dren Nell and Charles, and Benjamin and Tom.

2^o. I give and bequeath to my daughter, Catharine Maria Parish
 a tract of land on the west side of Long Creek, containing three hun-
 dred and a fifty acres, also the following negroes Zephaniah and his two
 children Cain and Peg, Nancy and her three children Elam, Dealy and
 Maria, also Aggy and Taph.

3^o. I give and bequeath to my sister, Mary Walker, one feather bed for
 future and certain, to be chosen by her.

It is my desire that so much of my pecuniary property be sold as
 will be sufficient to discharge my debts amounting to about two
 hundred dollars and the debts due and collected.

It is further my desire that my negroes be kept together, and employed
 in keeping up and cultivating the plantation I now reside on and the
 mulberry making such additional clearing and improvements as
 may be deemed necessary, so as not to exhaust the soil by continuous
 cultivation of the same ground; and that the case thereof be committed

by my managers to overseers or croppers as they may judge most
advisable, and that the profits arising therefrom be appropriated
to the schooling, clothing and maintaining of my children.
And it is further, my desire that if all of my negroes cannot be
advantageously employed in farming as aforesaid, that then five and
twelve be annually hired out, and in case Rachel or Ned or any of the
others should become superannuated and worn out, or otherwise incap-
acitated for labour, that they be taken particular care of and supported
by my estate.

Finally. I hereby appoint to execute this my last Will and Testament,
my brother, Richard Parish and brothers in law Thomas D King and
James Larkins Jnr, vesting them with discretionary powers to vary
any part of this my Will, where the execution of the same may be
deemed impolitic or impracticable.
