

In the name of God Almecht. I, Jonathan Isaac
of the County of New Hanover, and State of North Carolina, being
in perfect health of body and in perfect mind and memory,
thank's be to Almighty God, calling unto my mind the mortality
of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once
to die, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament, that
is to say, principally and first of all, I give and recommend my
soul unto Almighty God that gave it, and my body I recommend
to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discre-
tion of my executors, nothing doubting but at the general resur-
rection, I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of
God; and as touching such worldly estate wherewithal it hath
pleased God to bless me, I give, devise and dispose of the same
in the following manner, and form.

Through out for the sincere friendship and real regard I
have for John Murphy, Shoemaker, in the State and county aforesaid
I constitute make and ordain him sole ^{Heir &} Executor of this my last will
and Testament, all and singular my moneys, goods and chattels,
by him freely to be possessed and enjoyed.

And I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke and disannul all and every
other former testaments, wills, legacies, bequests and executors by me in
any ways before named, willed and bequeathed, ratifying & confirming
this and no other to be my last will and Testament. In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 17th day of May, in the
year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy nine.
Signed, sealed, published, pronounced and Jonathan Isaac. ^{Seal}
declared by the said Jonathan Isaac as his last
will and Testament in the presence of us, who in
his presence, and in the presence of each other,
have hereunto subscribed our names.

N.B. The word, Heir, being interlined before
us and before we signed, with the fore will of
the said Jonathan Isaac, between the six-
teenth & seventeenth line from the top.
