Second I Give and bequeath unto my daughter  
Mary Johnston five heads of Cattle which  
has been delivered, also I give to my daugh-  
ter Elizabeth Johnston Five heads of cattle  
which has been delivered, The balance of  
My Stock to remain on the Plantation until  
after my decease & my wifes, And after our  
Deaths to be equally divided between David &  
Nancy Johnston, Also the House hold & Kitchen  
Furniture Forming utensils Notes Money and  
Book accounts to be equally divided between  
David and Nancy Johnston, And I  
hereby make and ordain my beloved children  
James Johnston & David Johnston of this my  
Last will and Testament, In witness whereof  
I have hereunto set my hands and first  
My Seal, In presence of us.

bearing date the twenty first January one thousand  
and eight hundred & forty five recorded in  
Registers office Book B.B. Page 420 and also to  
a certain tract of land lying and being in New
