Know all men by these presents that I Malcom Marshall do make and ordain this my last will & testament in the manner and form following.

First I give and bequeath to my sister Frances Corbett during her life and at her death to my nephew Jasper Corbett my negro man William the said negro not to be hired out at my death but to pass immediately into the possession of my sister Fanny and at her death immediately into the possession of my nephew Jasper Corbett without ever being hired out in either case.

Secondly I give and bequeath to my sisters Fanny Corbett & Nancy Due jointly my negro boy Joshua to be valued by my Executor & one to take the negro the other to receive half of his value to be paid by the other & should Mrs. Corbett get the said boy Josh at her death the same as the boy William to go to Jasper on the same conditions.

Thirdly I give and bequeath to my sister Nancy Due my neg girl Lomew and at her death to go to my niece Alias Due the said girl to pass into the possession of my sister Nancy immediately and at her death to pass into the possession of my niece Alias Due without ever being hired out and should Nancy Due get the boy Joshua before mentioned at her death the boy Joshua to pass immediately into the possession without ever being hired out of Alias Due.

Fourthly I give & bequeath to my nephew Thomas Marshall son of J. M. Marshall my negro girl Catharine.

Fifthly I give and bequeath to my niece Lydia W. Marshall my negro girl Hannah Jane both of the last named negroes to pass after my death immediately into the possession of J. M. Marshall for the use of the children & remain in his possession until the children arrives at age or get married then they are to take possession of them for their benefit.

Sixthly I give and bequeath to my brother John M. Marshall Nancy and her children or child not heretofore given away & should the said J. M. Marshall die the negroes not to be hired out but to remain on the plantation for the use of the widow and children I furthermore give the said J. M. Marshall all the crop that I may have at my death and all the provisions I may have at my death.

Seventhly I give to my nephew William C. Marshall Fifty Dollars when he arrives at the age of twenty one to be paid by Fanny Corbett, Nancy Due & John M. Marshall or the holders of the property given or loaned first to them in equal portions.

Eighthly I give & bequeath to my Nieces to wit: Ann E. Flinn daughter of William Flinn Mary C. Flinn daughter of James Flinn & Julia C. Flinn eldest daughter of John Flinn fifty

dollars apiece when they arrive at the age of twenty one, or  
get married to be paid by Fanny Corbett, Nancy Due &  
John M. Marshall is the parties holding the property  
first loaned or given to them & at their death to others.  
Nintyly. I give to Mary C. Due fifty dollars to be paid  
by J. M. Marshall, Fanny Corbett & Nancy Due equally  
proportionally.

Lastly I appoint my worthy friend Joseph Green my ex-  
ecutor to carry out this my last will & testament.

I further give & bequeath to Martha J. Roberson conditionally  
the boy Joshua Providence Columbus Roberson has a child  
living & at the death of his mother the boy Joshua to go  
to Columbus but should Columbus have no child  
at my death the boy Joshua to remain as first given &  
should Martha J. Roberson get the boy Josh she must  
pay her proportionable part of the two hundred & fifty  
dollars given to my relatives in money.
