mind and memory, do make and ordain this to be my last
and Testament, Bif.

In primitis. My wish is to be buried in a frugal manner, &
Secondly. That my just debts be duly paid,
Thirdly. I give, devise and bequeath to my dear daughter, Elizabeth
- all my estate, real, personal and mixed, or of what nature
or kind soever it may be; my right to a part of which may appear
by reference to a written paper of Memorandum of this date signed
by my own hand.

Forthwith I do hereby nominate and appoint, William Hooper
and James Giske Esquires, Executors of this my last Will and
Testament, and I beg leave to recommend my orphan child
to their guardianship and direction, humbly requesting their
attention to her education and morals.

and with all due deference, I do humbly, earnestly & solemnly
intreat the Executors of the last will of Cornelius Harmsz. to
do justice and be friendly to my unfortunate daughter, as
for her father's, as her own sake.

Almighty God having been graciously pleased to spare my life till now, I have time and opportunity more fully and more to reflect on my spiritual and temporal concerns; since the time which I executed and signed the third day of May last, appearing in some things deficient, I have thought proper to make this codicil to my will, taking the choice of my death.

Mr^s. Boya of this town having taken the charge of my dear child Elizabeth Hammett, I desire my Executors William Hooper and James Leikie Esquires, to be assured that I am perfectly satisfied and happy therein; nevertheless should any accident happen to Mrs. Boya, then and in that case, I hope and trust my Executors will have my dear child put under the care of some good and worthy friends -

Worthy friend -
Item. Considering that the life of my dear child Elizabeth Hamer
is like the life of all mortals, very precarious, therefore should
said child Elizabeth die unmarried before she arrives to the age
twenty one years, then my desire and will is, that the negro
slave named Kate be given to Polly Holt whom I expect

sons, and her heirs forever; and that all the residue of my property of whatever kind as mentioned in my will aforesaid be equally divided between Elizabeth the daughter of William & Jane Hooper, Mary the daughter of James & Rebecca Geikie, Annana John the son of Moses John & Mary Dekopet; each to have and hold one third part for themselves and their fair posterity. I desire my executors nominated in my said will to look upon this Codicil as a part of my last Will and Testament bearing theseunto put my hand and seal as such this eleventh day of July 1783.

All the residue of my estate real and personal I give and devise to the said Thomas MacLaine his heirs executors and administrators respectively -
