

In the name of God Amen. I, Margaret James
being weak in body, but in perfect senses, and mindful of the
mortality of human nature, think proper to make this my last
will and Testament.

First. I give my body to be interred at the discretion of my friends.

2^d. I give and bequeath unto my oldest son Timothy Bloodworth
the plantation whereon he now lives, containing one hundred acres
conveyed to me by my father, David Evans.

3^d. I give and bequeath unto my second son David Bloodworth a
negro girl named Doll.

4th. It is my desire that my son Timothy or James Bloodworth
take the negro fellow named Isaac, at the price of one hundred
and fifty pounds, pay all my lawful debts, and the remaining
part to be divided as hereafter directed.

5th. I give and bequeath the remaining part of my estate in
the following manner, viz, to be divided into four equal parts
(excepting some trifles which I have already disposed of, and
my bed and bedding which I give to my granddaughter, Milner)
one of which I give to my son Robert Bloodworth; one part to my
son James Bloodworth; one part to be equally divided between
my daughter, Sarah Campbell and her son Timothy Wilson; and
one part to be equally divided between my two grandsons Timothy
and Thomas Bloodworth the sons of Thomas Bloodworth, to whom
I give five shillings lawful money.

Lastly. I appoint and constitute my son Robert Bloodworth Exe-
cutor, to my last Will and Testament, to manage and dispose of
my estate in the manner heretofore directed. Should the negro
fellow Isaac die before the estate is settled, in that case the
legates to pay an equal part of the debt proportioned to their
shares, supposing the whole to be in equal parts.
