I, Margaret M^cDuffie of the County of New Hanover, in the State of North Carolina, calling to mind the uncertainty of life, and the certainty of death, being of sound and perfect mind and memory, do make, publish and declare this my last will and Testament.

1st. I give and bequeath unto my son, Patrick M^cDuffie, my negro boy Sam,

2nd. I give and bequeath unto my daughter, Ann M^cDuffie, my negro woman and Charity, and her child and her future increase.

3rd. I leave the residue of my property to be equally divided among my next of kin (including my said son Patrick, and my daughter, Ann) according to law.

And I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my worthy friend James Kerr, Executor, to this my last will and Testament, revoking all former wills, I hereby declare this to be my last will and Testament.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the 17th of September, A.D. 1841.
