I, Margaret H. Wade, of the town,

of Wilmington, County and State aforesaid, being of sound mind and memory, but in feeble health, do make, and declare this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all others made by me:

First. It is my will, that my Executor, hereinafter named, shall provide for my body, a decent burial, and pay all my funeral expenses, together, with, all my just debts, to whomsoever due, out of the first monies, that may come into his hands, as a part, and parcel of my estate.

Secondly. I give and bequeath, in equal shares, to my three daughters, Ann H. Wade, Emma P. Wade, and Caroline H. Wade, my house and lot on the corner where I now live; lot one hundred and twenty-four, by sixty six feet; which, lot and house, is not to be divided or sold, while my daughter, Ann H. Wade remains unmarried; it being my wish and desire, that she shall have it for a home for herself and my other children, until she marries; when, it may be sold, and be equally divided, between my three daughters.

Thirdly. I give and bequeath, to my daughter, Ann H. Wade, my negro woman, Mississ, and her, increase, for life, to come in proportion of her, at my death.

Fourthly. I give and bequeath, to my son George B. Wade, my negro man Peter, to come in proportion of him, when my son John H. Wade, has arrived at the age of seventeen years, and not before.

Fifthly. I give and bequeath, to my daughter, Emma P. Wade, my negro girl, Mary Ann, but not to come in proportion of her, till she marries.

Sixthly. I give and bequeath, to my daughter, Caroline H. Wade, my negroes Fanny and Nancy, to come in proportion of them, when she marries, and not before.

First. I direct that all my debts and funeral expences be paid, as soon, after my decease as possible, out of the first monies, that shall come into the hands of my executors, from any portion, of my estate real or personal. Item. I hereby give, bequeath and devise, unto my beloved wife Elizabeth B. Newton and her heirs, all my right, title and interest in the Pilot Boat Edward B. Dudley, being one third thereof; the tract of land or plantation, wherein I now live, with all the hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging; also my negro boy, Hardy; all my stock, of every description; all my household and kitchen furniture, of every description; and all other property or estate, of which, I may die, seized or possessed, whether real, personal or mixed, unto my said wife Elizabeth B. her heirs and assigns forever.

Item. I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my wife Elizabeth B. and my friend George R. French, executors of this my last Will and Testament.
