 Walton, Mary Walton and Bastie Walton children of Jane Walton,
 all my personal estate, which is not heretofore given away, to be
 by my Executors sold, and the monies so arising to be equally divid-
 ed between the said children, namely, Rebecca, Easter, Sarah, Mary
 and Bastie Walton children of Jane Walton. And I do hereby, lend
 unto Jane Walton, the plantation I bought of Thomas Bishop and
 the Mill Swamp, until Bastie Walton comes of age or marries, to
 be owned and so,
 And I do hereby utterly revoke, disannul, and make void all other
 Wills or Testaments by me made, ratifying and confirming this and
 no other to be my last Will and Testament.
 And I do hereby appoint and ordain my good friends Robert
 Nixon, Nicholas Nixon, Dan Walton and John Fulwood my Execu-
 tors of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I

1808. Monday evening between eight and nine o'clock, I observed an unfavorable change in James Miller (late of the Island of Jamaica in the West Indies) and remarked to him, as he was among strangers (Allen being his physician) that it was a duty incumbent on me, to state the uncertainty of his recovery; therefore should be obliged to ask him, if he had a written Will by him; to which he replied, he had not. I then told Mr. Miller that I had been informed he had two sons in Jamaica, he answered he had, that the one was a Merchant and the other a Clerk. I then suggested to him as Mr. Hanson Kelly was a correspondent of his sons, that it might be proper to nominate him, in the event of his death to take charge of such property as he had in this country; to this, he made no reply. After waiting some time, I told Mr. Miller, I had understood it was his desire and will that Mr. Allen Wood and his heirs should inherit all the property he might leave in this country; he answered this was his will. I then asked him, if he wished in case of his death, that I should bear testimony in favour of Mr. Wood and his heirs to that effect, he answered Yes you will as this has long been my desire, that Mr. Wood and his heirs shall possess all that I have in this country.
