In the Name of god Amen. I Martha Doyles of the County of New Hanover & State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory, doth considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this to be my last will and testament in manner & form following That is to say,

First. That after my decease, my body shall be decently buried without ostentation or unnecessary expense, and that my funeral expenses be paid by my executor hereinafter named.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Anna Willy wife of Henry W. Willy during her natural life Seven Negroes vizt. Chetey, London, Leaven, Sarah, David Sampson and Bill, to have and to hold during her natural life

Item I give and bequeath to my Grand daughter Mary Jane Sheppard wife of John Sheppard Eight Negroes vizt. City, Morris, Lott, Sandy, Rebecca, George, Peter & Jane to have and to hold to her her heirs and assigns in fee simple forever

Item. I give and bequeath unto Henry W. Shepard Son of my Grand Daughter three negroes Aig, London, Leah & Bill, except the life estate of my daughter Anna Wible devised in a former Item of this my will to have & to hold together with the increase of said negroes in fee simple forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto John Gamble Shepard Son of my Grand Daughter four negroes Aig, Chesey, Sampson Sarah & David except the life estate of my daughter Anna Wible devised in a former item of this my will to have and to hold together with the increase of said negroes in fee simple forever.

Item. And whereas Henry W. Shepard Son of my Grand Daughter is a minor and will not arrive at the full age of twenty one years until the 25th day of November A.D. 1859 And also John Gamble Shepard Son of my Grand Daughter will not arrive at the full age of twenty one years until the 8th day October A.D. 1861. Now therefore if the life estate of my daughter Anna Wible Should Cease before the Said Minors Should arrive at the full age of twenty one years it is my will and desire that them their father John Shepard take into Care, and Custody the said Minors until they shall arrive to the full age of twenty one, or at such other time as they may call for them. And I do hereby appoint my friend John Shepard my sole executor of this my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I take the said Martha Dyles both hereunto set my hand and seal this 26th day of December 1849. Signed Sealed published & declared by the said Martha Dyles to be her last will and testament in the presence of us who at her request and in her presence do subscribe our names as witnesses thereto.
