

In the name of God Amen. I Mary Plager, of the town of Wilmington, New Hanover County, North Carolina, though weak, in body, yet of a sound and perfect understanding, do constitute this my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following, that is to say—

I will that all my debts and funeral charges be paid and discharged by my Executors hereinafter named—

I give and bequeath unto my daughters Mary and Comfort of my lot on the North side of Market Street, and at the Market Wharf, that part on which the bake house now stands, and which I formerly lived in, to be held by them jointly, their heirs &c. I also give and bequeath unto my son Stephen the remainder of the above mentioned lot, beginning at the west end of the bake house and running out to the end of the Wharf, being now in the occupancy of James Breunon, to the said Stephen my son, his heirs forever.

Lastly. I do make and constitute Henry Loomer, William Evans Executors to this my last Will and Testament, dated at Wilmington this twenty eighth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety. In Witness whereof I have hereunto affixed my hand and seal—
