My last Will and Testament -
I give, devise and bequeath three fourths of all my estate of every kind whatsoever, except as is hereinafter specified, to my nephew Moses John DeKopet and Armand Mrs DeKopet, my grand son Henry Towner, and my friend William Lord their heirs, executors and administrators forever, in trust and confidence, to and for the uses, intents, and purposes hereinafter expressed, and to and for no other use, intent or purpose whatever, viz, to and for the sole and separate use of my daughter Mary F Lord, the widow, of the late Mrs B Lord, during her natural life and in the event of her marrying again, not to be under the control, or in any way subject to the liabilities, contracts or incumbrances of a future husband, but to remain to her sole and separate use, notwithstanding the coverture, during her life as aforesaid; and at the death of the said Mary F Lord, should she die, leaving children surviving her, at the time of her death, then to and for the use of such children, their heirs, executors and administrators forever, to be equally divided among them share and share alike, as tenants in common; or if she should leave but one child surviving her at the time of her death, then to and for the use of such child, his or her heirs, executors and administrators forever. And in case the said Mary F Lord should die, without leaving issue surviving her, at the time

of her, death, then to and for the use of my heirs at law, their heirs, executors and administrators forever, in the following proportions, to wit, one fourth part of said three fourths to my son John D. Toomer, his heirs, executors and administrators forever; two fourths of said three fourths to my daughter, Eliza A. Young, her heirs, executors and administrators forever; and the other fourth of said three fourths to the children of my son Lewis H. Toomer, dec'd, reserving however the reversion thereof should they all three die during their minority to my son John D. Toomer, and my daughter, Eliza A. Young, their heirs, executors and administrators forever, share and share alike.

I give, devise and bequeath to my daughter, Mary H. Lord, the remaining fourth of my estate to be disposed of as she may think proper, to her, her heirs, executors and administrators forever.

I give and bequeath to my son John D. Toomer, his executors and administrators forever, the large portrait of his father, painted in oil colours, and the large family bible and the old desk, both of which have been his father's.

I give and bequeath to my daughter, Eliza A. Young, her executors and administrators forever, the miniature likeness of her father.

I give and bequeath to my beloved nephew, Moses Fur. DeKopet, a large soup spoon and the silver tea spoons all of which are marked with the initials of his grandfather's name, to him, his executors and administrators forever.
