I Montesquieu W Campbell of the County of New Hanover, and State of North Carolina, being in perfect health of body, and of sound disposing memory, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament, It is my will that the plantation on which I live, together with all my personal estate, and household and kitchen furniture, and all other species of property that I may die possessed of or entitled to, be given to my house keeper Mary Brinkley, to be disposed of by her, in any way and manner she may think proper; having made no other Will, it is unnecessary to revoke all others.

Thereby appoint the said Mary Brinkley executrix of this my last Will and Testament.
