

In the name of God Arueit. the seventeenth day
of April in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred
and seventy one, I Nathaniel McGeofford of the Parish of St. James
and County of New Hanover, being infirm of body, but of perfect
mind and memory, thank be given unto God therefore, calling
to mind the mortality of my body, and knowing it is appointed
for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last
Will and Testament, that is to say principally and first of all,
I recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it and
as for my body I recommend it to the earth to be buried in a
christian like and decent manner, at the discretion of my exec-
utors, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection to receive
the same again by the mighty power of God. And as touching
my worldly estate wherewithal it hath been pleased God to bless me
with in this life, I give, devise and dispose of the same in the
following manner, and as follows,

Item. I give and bequeath to my son Nathaniel McGeofford
the dwelling house and plantation whereon I now lie, together
with two hundred acres of land belonging thereto; also his
equal part of all my negroes, cattle, horses, hogs, housefurniture
viz stock and blocky,

Item. I give and bequeath to my well beloved son Samuel
McGeofford, one tract of land containing two hundred acres,
at or near Harris Landing, together with his equal part
of all my negroes, viz, stock, and blocky,

Item. I give and bequeath unto my well beloved daughter
Ann McGeofford her equal part of all my negroes, cattle, viz
stock, and blocky,

Item. I give and bequeath unto my well beloved daughter
Jane McGeofford her equal part of all my negroes, cattle, viz.
stock, and blocky,

Item. I give and bequeath unto my well beloved daughter, Margaret
McGeofford her equal part of all my negroes, cattle, viz stock, and blocky
she being my youngest daughter,

Item. I give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife Mary McGeofford
the sum of five pounds proclamation money, also a suit of mourning,

Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Agnes Palmer esq
McGeofford also Ryed five shillings sterling money,

Item. I give and bequeath unto my son William Palmer esq McGeofford
five shillings sterling money,

Item. I give and bequeath unto my three sons, viz Nathaniel, William

about seven years of age and Samuel, these three only for to share a
share alike, in all my outstanding debts, and all the money I had
by me, each having one third part after discharging my funeral
expences.

I do appoint, constitute and ordain my friends Frederick Duck,
Jones and James Mc Gufford my executors of this my last Will and
Testament, and do hereby disallow, revoke and disannul all and
every other former, Will and Testament, bequeathed and executed by
me in any way before the time mentioned, willed or bequeathed,
ratifying and confirming this and no other, to be my last Will

Richard Miller, of the State and County aforesaid
being of full age and of sound mind, doth, that on or about the 17th day of April 1793
he was called upon by Nathaniel Mc Gufford with Joel Parish, to witness
the Will of the aforesaid Nathaniel, he then being in perfect and sound
mind and memory; accordingly he the said Richard saw the said
Nathaniel sign, seal, publish and declare the will hereunto annexed
be his last Will and Testament; he himself witnessed the same, and
said Joel Parish witnessed the same. In witness whereof this 17th day
March 1793 I have hereunto set my hand and seal.

The last Will and Testament of Nathaniel Mc Gufford deceased
exhibited into Court at June Term 1793, and as Richard Miller, the
