I Neal Henry of the County of New Hanover and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say.

First. That my executors hereinafter named shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relations and friends and pay all funeral expenses together with my just debts however and to whomsoever owing out of the first moneys that may come into their hands as a part or parcel of my estate.

Item first. I give to my beloved wife Charity Henry and our five Children William C. Henry. John C. Henry. Robert A. Henry. Elizabeth Ann Colvin. Margaret Jane Burlington at my death after my just debts are paid, all my Negroes. Stock of all kinds. Household and kitchen furniture. also Money. Notes and Accounts to be equally divided between my wife and our five children as named above - the portion allotted to my daughter Margaret Jane Burlington to be to her own use during her life then to the heirs of her body.

And lastly. I do hereby constitute and appoint my two Sons William C. Henry. Robert A. Henry my lawful executors to all intents and purposes to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof. hereby declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made.

In witness whereof I the said Neal Henry do herunto set my hand and seal this 24 day of September AD. 1866

Signed, sealed, published and declared Neal Henry Seal by the said Testator to be his last Will

and Testament in the presence of us, who at his request and in his presence do subscribe our names as witnesses thereto.
