The above last Will and Testament of Sarah Harris was exhibited in Court and proved by the oath of Henry Toomer a subscribing witness thereto, who swore that the Testator did sign, seal, publish and declare the same to be and contain her last Will and Testament, and that he believes she was of sound and disposing mind and memory. Also that Mary Toomer, signed at the same time as a concurring evidence thereto. At same time Tho: MacLaine qualified as Executor to the said Will. Ordered that letters testamentary issue to the said Thomas MacLaine agreeable to Law.

In the name of God Amen. I, Onesimus Hutch being through the abundant mercy and goodness of God, though weak in body, yet of a sound and perfect understanding and memory, do constitute this my last Will and Testament, and desire it may be received by all as such.

First. I most humbly bequeath my soul to God my maker, beseeching his most gracious acceptance of it through the all sufficient merits and mediation of my most compassionate redeemer Jesus Christ. I give my body to the earth from whence it was taken in full assurance of its resurrection from thence at the last day. As to my burial, I desire it may be decent, at the discretion of my dear wife.

As to my worldly estate, I give to my dear and loving wife during her widowhood the house wherein I now dwell, with all the furniture, and the lands and tenements that lie about it, with my stock of hogs, cattle and sheep.

I give to my son Martinee one hundred acres of land lying on the west side of Sawyer's Creek.

I give to my son James one hundred acres of land lying on the west

side of Sawyers Creek, with all my black smiths tools,
 I give to my son Jacob, one hundred and sixty acres of land lying
 upon Bull Tail, joining John Hatch's line,
 I give to my son John one hundred and twenty five acres of land, wh
 ere I now live, also one hundred and fifty acres of land, now patent
 adjoining to it,
 I give to Simon Malpas son of Simon Malpas, two hundred
 acres of land, lying between Smith's creek, and lands of the Rev^d
 Mr Tate.
